# V. COURSE STRUCTURE AND REQUIREMENTS

#### **Structure**:

The lectures will be based on the textbook. From the very beginning, students will attempt to memorise some common Greek vocabularies as well as translate Greek sentences into English. Relevant assignments and short tests will be given regularly in order to evaluate the progress of learning.
