Course Description:

This course explores practices and expressions of worship in the Bible so as to develop biblical principles of worship for application to the worship of our time. Biblical texts will be surveyed through lens of corporate worship. Special emphasis will be given to the biblical spirituality of worshiper.

Learning Outcomes:

By the end of this course, students are able to:

- 1. Be familiar with spirituality of worshiper and biblical practices of worship.
- 2. Articulate biblical principles of worship.
- 3. Demonstrate scholarly informed perspectives on issues associated with worship today.

Course Requirement and Assessment:

- 1. Class participation (30%): Students are expected to read one of Required Books of their choice (10% of the final grade)
- 2. Presentation (30%): 'Worship in the Bible' session
- 3. Term Paper (40%): 4000~4500 words; <u>due date: April 10th</u> choose one of the followings;
 - 1) Reflection paper on 'Spirituality of Worshiper' discussed in class;
 - 2) Reflection paper (from one of the following books):
 - Engaging with God (David Peterson)
 - Enter His Courts with Praise (Andrew E. Hill)
 - Called to Worship (Vernon M. Whaley)
 - 3) Research paper on topics related to biblical worship

Grading Rubrics:

All assignments will be graded according to student's demonstration of:

1. Research effort and ability with using source materials and lectures including class discussions

- 2. Quality of analysis of the issue and arguments with clear statement of thesis and its appropriate outcomes
- 3. Organization and quality of writing (i.e., grammatical and referencing errors)

Reflection Paper Guideline:

Reflection paper is NOT a summary of a book, but a conversation with the author. In this conversation, discuss 4-5 topics or subjects or issues on which you agree or disagree with the author. In this discussion, support your arguments by using other sources (books or articles) and class discussions including lectures. In this conversation, it is also expected to hear what you have learned from the reading of the book. Please follow The Chicago Manual of Style method of citation.
