I. Aim of the Course

Welcome for joining this course, the thesis writing. The purpose of this course is to prepare M.Div. / BD students for their graduate theses writing under the supervision of their individual academic advisor.

II. Learning Outcomes:

A) Knowledge Outcomes

With the thesis writing skills learned in this course, it is expected that all theses shall be submitted on time, end of May 2018. **Late submission may cause late graduation.**

III. Learning Activities

A) Lectures:

There will be regular lectures and/or tutorials in some weeks. The electronic teaching medium BLACKBOARD / Group email will serve as a discussion and information exchange forum.

B) Tutorials:

There are some group discussion and/or individual meeting during the semester; students are to be grouped together in 8-10 to discuss the papers.

C) Meeting with Academic Advisor:

Students should meet their academic advisor at least three times during the first semester. There will be a form for meeting details. Students shall keep it until the last meeting. And academic advisor shall submit the form with grading to the course instructor after last meeting.

[Assessment: Argument (5), Counter-Arguments (2), Organization (5), Writing Style (5), Citation (3)]
